April- Student Services

Safety is our #1 concern for our students, and as a parent, our children. We all want our children to be happy, healthy, and **safe**. We, as educators and parents, need to constantly be teaching our precious ones about how to be safe at school and home. Part of student services in the classroom this month will be focusing on problem solving situations in which students or their friends may be in unsafe situations and how/when to "do the right thing". We will talk about how safety is an important way to show respect because it protects people and our environment. We will talk about the rules of safety at school and at home and that rules are for our protection. At home, you can review safety information with your child(ren). For example, would your child know what to do in an emergency at home?

The second half of the month will be about **internet safety**. This is an important, yet sensitive topic, since some students are more internet savvy than others. For K-2 grades, we will be reviewing the booklet of Webby the Internet Safety Cat, which is endorsed by Wood County Crimestoppers. Each student will receive a booklet and I will be reviewing the content in the classroom setting the week of April 16th. I hope you will take time to review the booklet with your child and answer any further questions they may have about the rules in your household about "screen time", passwords, and never giving out personal information or sending pictures.
