Student Services—A message from Mrs. Kuhn

Students in K-2 have just completed the “Skills for Learning” unit during Student Services classroom time. They learned about listening skills, focusing attention, self-talk and being assertive. The Second Step curriculum has specific classroom lessons for each grade. Kindergartners and 1st graders have been introduced to two puppets named, “Puppy” and “Slow-down Snail”. The students seemed to be engaged in learning style of interactive play. Second graders have been learning the “The Learner Song” which focusing on all the learning skills and being respectful. After the lesson, there is often a “home-link page” that is sent home in your student(s) folder to be completed with your child at home and then returned to school. For students who return their home-link page, they are awarded a sticker of their choice. This is to encourage a home-to-school connection of what is being learned as school is reinforced at home. Please take time to complete the home-link page with your child. Our next unit will focus on empathy and learning about feelings. Thank you for working with your child on these important life skills.

OLQH positive behavior intervention and support (PBIS) program this year is about being positive and kind to others. Therefore, our bulletin board reads, “Be a Paws-itive Influence”. As students see kind things happening in the classroom, hallway, or playground, they can nominate a student or staff person who has done a kind act for someone. Students/staff/parents can write the person's name on a paw and it will be posted on the bulletin board. We hope to fill
