# Assumption Middle School's Tip of the Week

#### **ORGANIZATIONAL SKILLS:**

Staying connected with child as they grow more independent can be a challenge for parents, but it's more important than ever. While activities at school, new interests, and expanding social circles can become more central to the lives of many middle school students, parents and guardians are still their anchors for providing love, guidance, and support.

Make efforts to talk with your child every day, so they know that what goes on at school is important to you. When your child knows their parents are interested in their academic lives, they'll take school seriously as well.

Because communication is a two-way street, the way you talk and listen to your child can influence how well he or she listens and responds. It's important to listen carefully, make eye contact, and avoid multitasking while you talk. Be sure to ask open-ended questions that go beyond "yes" or "no" answers.

Besides meals, good times to talk include car trips, walking the dog, shopping, or before bed. When preteens know they can talk openly with their parents, the challenges of middle school can be a little easier to face.

### MIDDLE SCHOOL ATHLETIC INELIGIBILITY



Participation in athletics is a privilege with responsibilities. At AMS, academics and behavior, take priority over athletics. Participation in athletics is dependent on the player maintaining good grades and good behavior in school. Please take a moment to review athletic eligibility in your AMS student/parent handbook, or see attached document for criteria used to determine academic eligibility of AMS athletes.

Report Cards grades will be posted on November 22<sup>nd</sup>, and the Academic Ineligibility period begins on November 25<sup>th</sup>. Any AMS student who receives a failing grade (F) on their report card will be ineligible to participate in basketball practices and games for a minimum of one week (Nov 25-Dec 2). A letter of ineligibility will be sent home on November 22nd and the coaches and athletic director will be notified of status.
