Budget

Milk Caps are no longer a fundraiser and box tops are changing their program to become more online based. Info on this will be coming home in the Friday Folder. The two programs previously brought in about \$4000/year to Royal Parents

Due to the decreased revenue, the following line items were taken out of the budget this year:

Building Fund of \$500/building totaling \$2500

Class Fund of \$200/HS class totaling \$800

Technology Support

Staff Requests (\$1500)

The following changes are reflected in the current budget:

\$500 cap/school per school year for bussing (mainly used for CSW)

\$2500 total for fieldtrip support per year

Request for Funds

SVDP would like to take a field trip to Old World WI in Eagle WI once every three years. To help support this Mrs. Fochs has requested \$100/classroom (\$600 total) to offset the cost this year. This was approved by Royal Parents.

Fundraising
