

# A note from Mrs. Kuhn



As the snow begins to melt, students are thinking about different games and sports to play in the upcoming spring and summer months. I came across this website and thought it may be beneficial to highlight in this week's newsletter. Information was taken from [www.playworks.org](http://www.playworks.org)

Two core competencies for social emotional learning include social awareness and relationship skills. When students are socially aware, they practice skills like inclusion, respect, compassion, and empathy. Relationship skills include conflict resolution, cooperation, playing fair, and playing with students from different friend groups or ages. Here are six ways you can help your child practice social awareness and relationship skills during recess.

1. Teach children to play games that are inclusive. Everyone gets a turn or fair chance.
2. Model positive social skills. Lead by example and encourage positive language and good sportsmanship at home.
3. Play games that reinforce empathy. Discuss how it would make you feel in different situations.
4. Teach rock, paper, scissors, for possible fair play and a way to resolve simple conflicts.
5. Teach games that encourage cooperation/teamwork (cheer on each other/high fives)
6. Agree on the rules first, to prevent disagreement later.
