From the desk of Father Levi:

The source and summit of the Catholic faith is the Holy Eucharist. Our term "Eucharist" has its roots in two Greek words *eu* meaning "good" and *charizesthai* meaning "favor" or "rejoice!" Put together the sense of *eucharizesthai* is "gratitude." In coming before the Holy Altar of God, our first and strongest response should be joyful, awe-filled gratitude at His amazing goodness towards us. Every good thing that we ever experience in our lives comes directly from God. For this reason, thanksgiving is a quality that defines the Christian. God rejoices in giving us His gifts. We should rejoice in receiving them! This Thanksgiving holiday, take seriously the invitation to enter into this *good joy*. An opening prayer from the Mass "For Giving Thanks to God" that you might consider bringing into your family Thanksgiving celebration is:

O God, the Father of every gift, we confess that all we have and are comes down from you; teach us to recognize the effects of your boundless care and to love you with a sincere heart and with all our strength. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.
