Policy on Naming

Assumption Catholic Schools may consider honoring long time volunteers and staff for their service by naming a room or part of a building in their honor. The naming will be recognized by a sign near or on the room/facility using ACS logos and in such a manner as to not disrupt the educational and mission of the area.

Criteria

- 1. Nomination to the president and administration team is made by the staff person in charge of that department example athletics would be nominated by the AD.
- 2. The person must have a minimum of 20 years of service to Assumption Catholic Schools in volunteer and/or paid service
- 3. The nomination must include the rationale for such action
- 4. The administration team will approve the nomination and forward to the Dean for final decision.

Facility naming - large dollar donations

When large capital improvements (over \$250,000) such as building new facilities or extensive remodal of existing facilities are being funded, Assumption Catholic Schools will recognize all donors who provide over \$10,000 to said project by placing a plaque near or in the facility. If the a donor funds over 50% of the project, the donor may request consideration of a memorial name. This policy only applies to the facilities owned by Assumption Catholic Schools.

Food Service Payment Policy

It is the policy of Assumption Catholic Schools that parents/guardians prefund their lunch accounts. There is no set amount for the prefunding but it is suggested that a minimum of \$50 per student be deposited. Monthly charges will be posted to the family lunch account for all meals served to the students during the preceding month. If the balance is below \$20 it is requested that additional funds be deposited into the lunch account. In the event a family's balance falls below \$5 during the month a statement will be sent and additional funds should be deposited.

Families are encouraged to apply for the USDA free and reduced meal program at the beginning of the school year or when your financial situation changes. Contact Joe Anne Cephas for an application

No student at Assumption Catholic Schools will be denied the regular breakfast or lunch service due to account status. These students will not be allowed to have seconds or extra portions.

Families who are unable to make monthly payments into the lunch account and who do not qualify for the USDA program, may apply to the Feed My Sheep fund for temporary assistance on balances in arrears – contact Michele Haas for information.

All lunch balances must be settled in full by June 1 of the current school year or arrangements made for a payment plan.

Central Office Relocation

The need for the move.

- A. Reclaim 2 classrooms in the Assumption building
- B. Better security for scrip entrance

Options looked at

- A. Buy a building
 - a. Rejected due to cost and need to extensively remodel
- B. Rent office space in town
 - a. Rejected due to ongoing cost of rent and internet \$40,000 annual
- C. Build an office outside Assumption
 - a. Rejected due to cost \$500,000
- D. Remodel Athletic wing
 - a. Rejected due to cost and also loss of space would negate any benefit
- E. Move into SVDP rectory
 - a. Best option at least cost

Phase 1 – will take place in summer 2023

President, IT, HR and development will move into rooms on the 1st and 2nd floor of the rectory using the Chestnut St. Entrance. Father and parish continue to use about 2/3 of the 1st floor space

Costs to move will include new flooring and locks, hook into school network and moving furniture etc.

Phase 2 - undetermined time

Finance, scrip and enrollment will move into rooms on the 1st floor of the rectory. Parish uses 2 rooms in rectory, possible 3. Might move president to 2nd floor depends on layout and need for a conference room

Cost – new floor in the rooms for this phase of move, new locks, move furniture

This spring, we had 196 applications and are projecting 160 Choice students again.


Our Lady Queen of Heaven K-2 May 16, 2023 Commission Report

At St. Lawrence Early Childhood Center we are winding down our 4k school year and they are on Letter L tomorrow on our Alphabet Countdown! Last week they took a walking field trip to Dairy Treat and Mini Golf, and next week they will be wrapping up with a walking field trip to the McMillan Library.

While we have made the administrative decision not to be a host site next fall due to the fact we were unable to secure a qualified 4k teacher, we will graduate 16 kiddos on May 31st.

Ten of those graduates will be enrolling in our Kindergarten program at OLQH, which is one of St. Lawrence's largest incoming classes from our 4k program ever.

In the past, our enrollment during the summers at SLECC have been on the low side due to many of our parents are teachers in the area and choose to keep their children home for summer break. However, this summer, with the exception of our youngest classroom, we will be running at full capacity! Our center continues to be one of the most sought after sites for childcare in both our area and outlying areas. The waiting list is still almost 2 years out in our Infant/Toddler room which is a trend for most childcare centers. For those who have asked why is the wait so long, the answer to that is quite simple. Staff and space. We have ratios and square footage DCF Licensing Rules which ties our hands to how many children we can care for. We are grateful for our loyal families who continue to give us generations of children that want to come to SLECC!

We purchased some much needed new swings for our littles and are looking forward to a summer of sun and plenty of outdoor play!
