- Bylaws of Education Commission were included in packet.
- Discussion regarding name change of SLECC. Decision tabled until a later time.
- Fr. Schaller addressed our move towards a "Classical Curriculum"
  - An increasing movement is taking place to move towards this, due to the general decline of academic rigor and structure in schools.
  - In a Classical Curriculum focus is placed on the study of language, history, memorization, logic reasoning, speaking and writing. A school culture of moral virtue, decorum, respect, discipline, and studiousness among both students and faculty.
- Virtual School of Milwaukee
  - With 30+ home school students in our area, a discussion was had to see if ACS would be able to fill this need. Students would enroll in virtual school through ACS.
  - ACS would pay Catholic Virtual to run this program, keeping choice money and tuition dollars at ACS.

# Our Lady Queen of Heaven K-2 Sept. 19, 2023 Commission Report

The new school year is off to a great start. The students and staff are excited to be back and are enjoying learning together. We have eighty-eight students enrolled at OLQH.

Through the *Virtue=Strength* program our students are learning about the virtue of faith. This Catholic virtue-based formation program is being used in grades K-12 this year. One of the components of this program is Catholic identity through school ceremonies. Fr. Guanella conducted a classroom blessing ceremony on Friday, Sept. 1 as part of this program. He blessed our students and their classrooms.

Homecoming week is scheduled for Sept.18-22, 2023. Our OLQH students will participate in themed dress down days, attend an all ACS system Mass, and enjoy a special performance by the AHS band.

We have begun implementing the new Rod & Staff mathematics program from Memoria Press in our K-2 classrooms. The Memoria Press mathematics program fosters basic math mastery based on memorization and repeated practice in the lower grades.

Our students have finished taking their Renaissance Star tests (early literacy and/or reading, and math) for the fall testing window. The data received from the Star Assessments will be used by teachers and staff to learn what students already know, what they are ready to learn next, to monitor student growth and to identify students who many need additional help.

OLQH and SVDP faculty and staff are continuing our Compassion Resilience trainings this school year. In these trainings our staff will explore their professional role in alleviating student, colleague, and other's distress while maintaining their own well-being.



President's Notes for September

The school year is off to a great start. As you see on the enrollment report we had the largest student body in about 10 years. This is an effort by everyone who works for Assumption Catholic Schools and a testament to how we live our mission.

Notes from the Diocese – work is restarting on the Diocesan curriculum. As a guiding document the Diocese is using the Cardinal Newman Society Standards – these are more global statements – not specifics that would guide a teacher in a detailed lesson. That work is also ongoing.

The 5 diocese of Wisconsin are also looking at changing their requirements for administrators and teachers. There are two reasons behind this change – one is the influence of secular society on the DPI and some educator preparation programs and how some facets of this are in direct opposition to our Catholic faith. The second is the overall teacher shortage. I and an administrator from Aquinas will be working on a project for the superintendent's to recommend quality Catholic friendly alternatives to the traditional DPI license program.

As of 9/11/23 the controller search is still on going. We had a candidate but were unable to come to a mutually agreeable compensation agreement. The applications have been reopened.

Work on the budget for 2024-25 now begins in earnest. The first step is for Father Schaller and I to determine the dollar amount of the parish investment and then we move to other areas of the budget.

Auction Royale planning continues. The event is Saturday, November 4<sup>th</sup> to be held at The Ridges in the West Wing. Menu has been decided for a sit down meal. Mark Skibba and Phil Hartley have agreed to be the Auctioneers. We have a great group of volunteer ladies helping to solicit items in person, online and on the phone. We have had several meeting to date to brainstorm ideas of how to get our Assumption families, donors and community to attend. We have had a great response to Sponsorships and donations. Invites have been laid out. QPP now has the design and working with them for printing. We will be mailing the end of this week. Stay tuned for further details as we progress with the planning.

#### **Annual Appeal - November 2023**

Work will soon begin on our annual appeal mailing for Royal Fund 2023-2024. Projected mail date would be mid-November of this year.

#### **Class 1973 Stage Renovation Project**

I am currently working with Pete Brey, Brian Ruesch and Kevin Potter all from the 1973 AHS Alumni Class. This class is wanting to renovate our stage. Stage floor has been refinished. Molly Thomas and I are working with getting the correct measurements on the curtains before we order them. Donations have been coming in from the 1973 Class. To date, \$23,975.00 in donations have been received with the potential of another \$6,000 pledged. Their goal is to obtain \$25,000 for this project. The 1973 Class is scheduled to have their 50<sup>th</sup> Class Reunion with tours of AHS on Saturday, September 16, 2023 from 9am – 11am.

#### Class 1983 Reunion

The Class of 1983 is planning on a reunion on Friday, Sept 22/23<sup>rd</sup>. I am still waiting to hear back from them about which day would be best for a building tour.

#### Material Girls Quilt Club

Sue Wolfe, my contact for Material Girls Quilt Club, stated the group enjoyed their rental dates this past summer of June 15-17, 2023. They have already asked to return next summer, June 19-22, 2024. This coincides with the Cranberry Blossom Fest.
