OLQH Music Beat October 2023

In music class, we've been busy learning many songs and musical concepts. But mostly, we've been having fun! We've learned some new hymns such as "Go Out, Go Out", and "Holy, Holy, Holy". In October, students will also learn "Whatsoever You Do" which sings about charity and love for others.

Second graders have been working hard learning about tempos, half and whole notes and rests, pitch direction, and keeping a steady beat with songs like "I Can Sing a High Note", and "Poor Little Bug on the Wall".

First graders have been learning about pitch direction, high and low sounds, fast and slow tempos, and steady beat through songs like "Jack and Jill", and "The Grand Old Duke of York."

Kindergartners have been busy working on keeping a steady beat, determining pitch direction and singing echoes with songs such as "Fall Leaves," and "I Am a Pizza."

In September students learned about the composers Claude Debussy and George Gershwin. In October, we will discuss Edvard Grieg and highlight his "Peer Gynt Suite".

All October birthday students are invited to a special breakfast with Ms. Bruley. An invitation will be given to each student next week.



Important Bus Announcement!


WRPS and Nekoosa do not have school on October 27th.
